Most emergencies serviced by our fire fighters are not fire related, but are medical emergencies. If you suddenly stop breathing, our local firefighters will most likely arrive before an ambulance... same if you experience a heart attack, stroke or fall and break a bone. They are the operators of the jaws of life in serious car accidents and are trained in water rescue with knowledge and experience stabilizing minor to the most critical injuries where they can even assist in an escort to Dix Park for MedFlights into the best Boston hospitals. The Beverly Farms fire station is our assurance that highly trained first responders will arrive quickly and effectively for all vital emergency medical situations and fire emergencies. The national average emergency response time is 7 minutes. Surely, having a well-equipped and highly trained staff right in our own neighborhood, response times are even more swift for residents of Beverly Farms & Prides Crossing.

We are very fortunate to have a local fire station. Engine 3, which operates out of 2 West Street in Beverly Farms, is not just a point of pride for the Farms/Prides community, but the station itself increases our property values, provides jobs, and keeps our families and our property safe.

HOW IS THE ENGINE 3 STATION DOING?

Thankfully, our station is operating well! However, time has put stress on the physical structure that houses our brave first responders. The Beverly Farms Improvement Society (BFIS), in keeping with its charter of preserving and enhancing the attributes of this historic village, is partnering with the City of Beverly on a renovation project. The city has recently invested \$8,000 on repairs for new station doors. They are providing for all mandatory building necessity "must haves" and labor for all BFIS enhanced "nice to haves" by beautifying the interior and exterior, ensuring that our heroes may continue to be comfortable while keeping us safe.

After months of traveling around New England and New York, the two came to the conclusion that a New York style bagel and gourmet coffee along with high qualityfrozen yogurt would be a great fit in Beverly Farms. After consulting and taste testing with over 45 different bagel, coffee and ice cream establishments, they decided the two companies that undeniably stood out due to quality of product, customer service and overall enjoyable customer experience were Boston's Boston Bagel Company and Yoberry.

Boston Bagel Company was founded by New England natives Brian Gajewski and Adam Sandler on the principle of providing consumers with high quality food and exceptional customer service. Pairing an authentic New York style bagel with several types of homemade cream cheeses and over 25 types of hot and iced coffee, the company allows for its customers to customize their orders. The same concept applies to Yoberry, as there are several types of toppings to accompany the different flavors of froyo.

The newly constructed Beverly Farms train station is something to be very excited about. Thomas and Brookes have designed the space to create a rustic, homey, New England feel with a splash of modern touch. To keep the historic nature of the exterior, the building will be freshly painted the same color but have 5 colonial style windows added to it. Once inside, stone fireplace will greet you along with 95-year-old reclaimed Pennsylvania pinewood on several of the walls. Natural wood flooring and local artwork can also be seen in the building. Two new bathrooms, along with a sound system, are being installed to create an environment that is enjoyable for all. Before the doors open, paving on the left, center and right of the building will be completed.

The flow and design of the building is made to accommodate several different types of customers. One

type of customer could be someone who wants to quickly order breakfast or lunch. The entrance and exit are set to allow for a quick and easy in and out flow. The second type of customer could be someone who wants to order, eat and relax for a short period of time. There will be 12-15 barstools along the wall that faces Oak Street to allow for customers to enjoy their meals but exit quickly if needed. The third type of customer is someone who wants to order and stay for a while. The New England style living-room lounge is designed so that folks can hold meetings, student gatherings, community gatherings and family socials.

The business model that Brookes and Thomas have created is "Do Well By Doing Good." Both partners believe that it is extremely important to give back, do something that is greater than themselves and create social change. Thomas has been involved in 2 separate paralyzing hockey accidents, his first in August 2008 and his second in October 2009. Since his second accident, he has co-founded and become President of The Thomas E. Smith Foundation, a paralysis foundation which Brookes serves as a proud advisor. A portion of the annual proceeds from the Beverly Farms Boston Bagel Company and Yoberry location will be donated to The Thomas E. Smith Foundation to better the lives of those living with paralysis. Brookes and Thomas are extremely excited to have the opportunity to work in Beverly Farms and very much look forward to building long-term relationships with members of the community. Doors are scheduled to be open before summer's end.
