The Beverly Farms Improvement Society and Friends of Dix Park are excited to announce that with the amazing support of the Beverly Farms & Prides Crossing communities, we have the successfully completed our "Operation Fix Dix" fundraising campaign! Thanks to widespread support from residents, the City of Beverly and a few extraordinarily generous donations we exceeded our fundraising goal of \$75,000 in just three short months. All of the funds will be utilized at Dix Park including the establishment of a maintenance fund for the future. During this time of economic uncertainty, the outpouring of support is truly remarkable and a reflection of the generous community in which we all live.

What enhancements will Dix Park receive?

Dix Park will receive many upgrades, some of which are slated for Spring installation. These enhancements will improve park access, broaden the scope of park activities and make the park more welcoming for residents of all ages. An updated rendering of the plan is now on display at the Beverly Farms library and we encourage you to take a look. It is important to note, While we have carefully planned this extensive revovation and enlisted the public professional expertise throughout, changes to our plan may be made in the field during installation.

Some key improvements include:

- A new handicap-accessible, tree-lined entryway at Haskell Street with parking and new fencing
- A handicap-accessible pedestrian path from Hale Street and along Dix Way into the Park with fencing, crosswalks and stop signs to promote safety
- More than 1,100 new plantings and trees along the new Dix Way entrance
- A resurfaced tennis court, new fencing and netting
- A new multi-purpose court for skateboarding, bike riding, street hockey, hopscotch or whatever your imagination desires
- A repaved, restriped basketball court with new hoops

FRUITLESS NO MORE..... VIDALIAS is coming to town!

We are thrilled to announce the opening of Vidalias a fresh produce and groceria which will open at 9 West Street (the old Fruitful Basket location) in early May. Owner, Marilyn Donati has been farming for 25 years spending 23 years running Canaan Farm in Wenham. Last year, Marilyn also opened the successful Utopia Farm stand (near the entrance to the Manchester Athletic Club) selling produce from her 12 acre farm. Highly experienced and knowledgeable, Marilyn will co-run Vidalias with her daughter, Erika Wight and promises to offer **reasonably priced**, high quality produce from their own farm, as well as, from farms throughout MA and New England. They will also sell artisan cheeses, local breads, meat, milk, eggs, dry goods, and locally roasted coffee. Freshly made sandwiches and handmade breads from their own ovens will surely also be coveted. When asked what is Marilyn's inspiration she answered, "There are several answers to that question. While some of the answer is personal, the other is that I believe in a sense of community. I think it is something so necessary to us as human beings. With global communications becoming an everyday part of our lives and life moving so quickly, I believe that it is vital to hold on to that which is closest to us....family and community. Beautiful produce is my inspiration.....to hear people say, "oh what beautiful lettuce", that's the reward. Having a purpose is my inspiration." We look forward to welcoming Marilyn and Erika into our great community and supporting, what is sure to be, a local gem.

- An enlarged baseball field with new bleachers for all levels and types of play including softball
- New granite benches, bike racks, and picnic tables
- A new maintenance truck entrance

The Beverly Farms Improvement Society is grateful to everyone who participated in our fundraising campaign. We'd like to highlight, however, five remarkable donations and express our deep gratitude to each.

First, an **anonymous donor graciously** agreed to fund the installation of the new tennis court, the paving of the multi-purpose court and the installation of the stone dust track. Thank you for this extraordinary donation which will benefit Farms-Prides residents for many years to come.

The creation of a safe, handicap-accessible entryway from Haskell St. would not have been possible without the generosity of two Dix Park abutters. **The Townsend Family** donated to us a house lot of land adjacent to the park. This donation, along with an easement granted by **Al Noones** will enable the installation of a new, gently sloping entrance to the playground and park, including much needed parking.

Dinart and Ro Serpa, gracious and generous owners of Dunkin' Donuts for donating the repaved and restriped basketball court along with their continued support for Beverly Farms.

Throughout the entire process, **Mike Collins, Beverly's Director of Public Works** has advised us, fielding numerous telephone calls and emails. Mike was also able to secure a donation from a contractor who is willing to pay for the materials and installation of the new Townsend Family entryway at Haskell Street. The installation will include a sidewalk, trees, new fencing and a parking lot. We look forward to continuing to work closely with Mike as he takes the lead with the installation.

Preserving memories past and present

A meaningful part of any community-built project is the ability to highlight and memorialize members of the community who have made a difference. We owe a debt of gratitude to the local residents who helped make the "Fahms" a great community. To honor these residents, BFIS is pleased to donate 14 engraved stones that will be placed along the new pedestrian path at Dix Way. Recipients of the engraved stones are:

- **Debbie O'Brien**, a beloved wife, cherished mother, daughter and sister was like pure sunshine. Despite her struggle with multiple sclerosis, which sadly took her young life, no one can recall seeing this beautiful woman without a smile. We will fondly remember her kindness to all each time we see her name etched in stone next to that of her husband, Steve.....
- **Steve O'Brien** volunteers countless hours, days and weeks as President of the West Beach Corporation. Thanks to Steve's hard work, we have always been able to enjoy a well-maintained, clean and fun beach creating lasting memories for all. Steve also spent many years volunteering for the Hastings House, where he also served as President of the Board making numerous positive improvements.

- **Ralph and Madilyn Coluntino** helped the Beverly Farms Improvement Society (BFIS) for so many years an entire Farms Flyer would be needed to describe all of their contributions. Ralph served as President of West Beach Corporation for decades, while Madeleine served on the BFIS Board for more than 25 years. Ralph never turned down a BFIS request for help and while he always had some interesting suggestions for ways we could return his favors, we have settled on a nice stone honoring his and Madilyn's numerous contributions to our community.
- **Don O'Connor** - a proud Beverly Farms veteran & Fireman who is always willing to lend a hand to the Beverly Farms/Prides community.
